**Barclay Lane:** Short wooded path between the Manor Drive and the Woodland Walk. Peaceful, calm area with 1 bench.

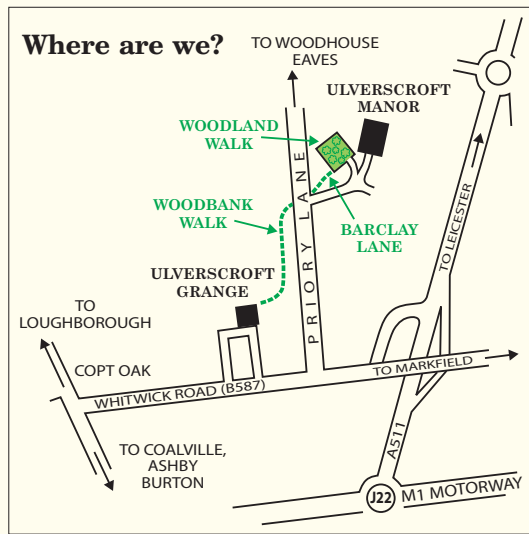

## ***What is the Shuttlewood Clarke Foundation?***

Founded in 1989 by the late Mr David Clarke, the Foundation is a registered charity situated on the edge of the Charnwood Forest. The main focus of its work is to ease loneliness and suffering and offer comfort to the elderly and adults of all ages with disabilities, within the Leicestershire area.

### ***Visitors***

The Foundation's two houses are used to entertain pre-booked groups Mon - Thurs.

These are either established groups catering for the elderly and/or people with disabilities or individuals drawn from different areas within the county. Each visiting group enjoys a freshly cooked two course lunch along with morning and afternoon refreshments and are free to enjoy the gardens, walks and facilities on offer.

### ***How do our visitors benefit?***

They enjoy the benefit of excellent food, good company, information and problem sharing, a happy atmosphere, relaxation and a chance to wind down.

### ***How can we arrange a visit?***

The Foundation's telephone booking diary opens in early January each year and dates are allocated on a first come basis. Each of our two houses cater for different sized groups with the Grange taking twelve visitors and the Manor eighteen. The Foundation's staff and volunteers are not trained carers and it is the responsibility of the organiser of the visiting group to ensure that they bring sufficient carers and a nominated first aider with them. ### ***Groups and individuals***

Organised groups who visit the Foundation include: Residential Homes, Disability Self Help Groups, Carer Groups, Sheltered Housing, Senior Citizen and Church Groups to name just a few. Individuals are welcome to go on our in-house register. They are referred to us by doctors, friends etc and receive invitations to visit the Foundation as either car day visitors, via bus or collection by our outside visiting team.

### ***Volunteers***

The Foundation is run by a small team of mainly part-time staff supported by a wonderful group of volunteers. Some of our volunteers work weekly, others fortnightly or monthly, establishing friendships and benefiting from the shared enjoyment of helping others.

Opportunities exist for volunteers in the following areas:

- Assisting the catering staff
- Befriending our visitors
- Gardening
- Light Maintenance
- Helping at fund raising events.

In addition to running our two houses at Ulverscroft the Foundation operates an **Outside Visiting Scheme**.

This is a visiting and befriending service which provides a listening ear, comfort and guidance where requested for those who are housebound, recovering from illness and in need. For more information telephone **01530 244914**.



### ***Disability Aid Loan Scheme***

Another aspect of the Foundation's work is the provision of Wheelchairs and Disability Aids on free indefinite loan to those in need. These include **Manual Wheelchairs, Electric Scooters and various other aids**. Requests for these items are referred through our Outside Visiting Team who make an assessment as to the suitability of the available equipment, liaising where necessary with health professionals.

### ***Equipment Required***

We are always looking to expand our stock. If you know of any unused wheelchairs or other items that could be donated to the Foundation, we would be delighted to re-allocate them to someone in desperate need.

### ***Fundraising Events***

During each calendar year the Foundation organises and runs a variety of fundraising activities and events.



Over the years these have included **Proms Nights, Victorian Garden Parties, Coffee Mornings, Concerts on the Lawn and a Flower Festival** as well as the Foundation's own **Quiz, Scarecrow Walk** and monthly **200 Club Draw**.

Fundraising income is extremely important to the long term development of the Foundation and your attendance and support at any of our events is gratefully welcomed and appreciated.

## ***Shuttlewood Clarke Foundation Visitor Walks***



The Foundation's walks are open to all of our in-house visitors at both the Grange and the Manor. In addition other groups and individuals wishing to enjoy these beautiful pathways or to paint, draw or photograph the wonderful views can do so Mon - Fri, 10.00am - 4.00pm by prior appointment only. (There would be no access to either house on these visits).

**Toilet facilities** suitable for people with disabilities are available at the wood yard car park end of the Woodland walk.

All of the pathways are designed to be **wheelchair friendly**, although certain sections may contain inclines, involve a short walk along the Manor drive and the crossing of Priory Lane. We therefore advise all users to take care, make use of any restpoints and only travel as far as they feel able.
